• Political autonomy and non-partisanship, openness for collaboration with public authorities and political institutions as partners

• Highest quality standards in the domains of arts and culture, as well in as its own operational performance.

ERIAC is envisioned as a membership-based organization, bringing together Roma and non-Roma individuals and organizations who are committed to ERIAC's founding values and who have relevant and demonstrated competencies and experience in the field of arts and culture.
